History

Long before fiberglass Opti's became the training boat of choice, wooden duck boats were used in Jr. Sailing programs up Bay. In 2000, philanthropist Peter Kellogg, donated an old plank on rib constructed duck boat (circa 1966) to the PBYC. It needed a complete restoration so Mr. Ralph Bush, Rich Morgan and a group of our Jr. Sailors did the work. Mr. Bush taught the children how to work on, and maintain, a wooden boat. When the ingredients of knowledge, enthusiasm and elbow grease were added, the boat was aptly named, "Duck Soup".

The World Duck Championships

Through the foresight and generosity of Peter Kellogg, the World Duck Championships were established sparking the resurgence and restorations of more than 75 Duck Boats. The evening before the annual regatta, all participating Duck Boats are displayed and judged on their upkeep and current condition. It is Peter's goal to preserve the history of the wooden duck boat era. As an incentive, each boat kept in "Bristol Condition", is eligible to receive up to \$1,000. The boat crowned "Queen of the Show" can receive up to \$5,000. This is a "one-time" award. Over the years our boat has generated nearly \$30,000 for the PBYC Jr. Sailing Program.

2013 Restoration Project

Over the last several years our boat suffered the effects of age, water and weather damage and needed a complete restoration. Unfortunately, the damage was so severe; it required real ship building craftsmanship to ensure the boat would remain a viable part of our club's history. So, in the Fall of 2012, the boat was sent back to its maker, Beaton Brothers, for a boat-builders makeover. After surviving Hurricane Sandy at the boat yard, the center board trunk and keel were replaced. Multiple boards on the deck and hull were replaced and all boards fasten and sealed. With the boat back in Pine Beach, Steve Toal and crew completed the restoration in the Toal's garage. When the boat was finished it was unveiled at the 2013 World Duck Championships. On the night of the judging, the boat received tremendous accolades and was named "Queen of the Show", an honor given to the most beautifully restored boat. With an unprecedented gesture, the standard prize was doubled to \$10,000 recognizing the quality and extensiveness of the restoration.

2018 "Mallard" Joins PBYC's Fleet

Mallard, a cold molded built duck boat was generously donated to the PBYC by Mike Benevito. The boat was officially grandfathered into the World Duck Championships in 2010. It allows additional Jr. Sailors to participate in the World Ducks and generate additional funds for our Jr. sailing program.
